

Have you been a victim or witness of racism? What should you do?

Racial discrimination can occur in all areas of life: school, work, leisure activities, etc. The Bureau de l'intégration des étrangers et de la lutte contre le racisme (Office for the Integration of Foreigners and the Fight against Racism) offers a listening ear, information and advice to anyone affected by racism, whether as a victim or as a witness.

What should you do if you are a victim or witness of racism?

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Consultations are free of charge and confidential.

Consultations can take different forms:

- by face-to-face interview
- by phone
- by email

Do you want to report a situation of discrimination?

Always provide as much information and documentation as possible.

For example: take notes (who, what, place, date), take photos, keep messages and videos.

Do you want to file a complaint? All this evidence can be useful for taking the case further.
